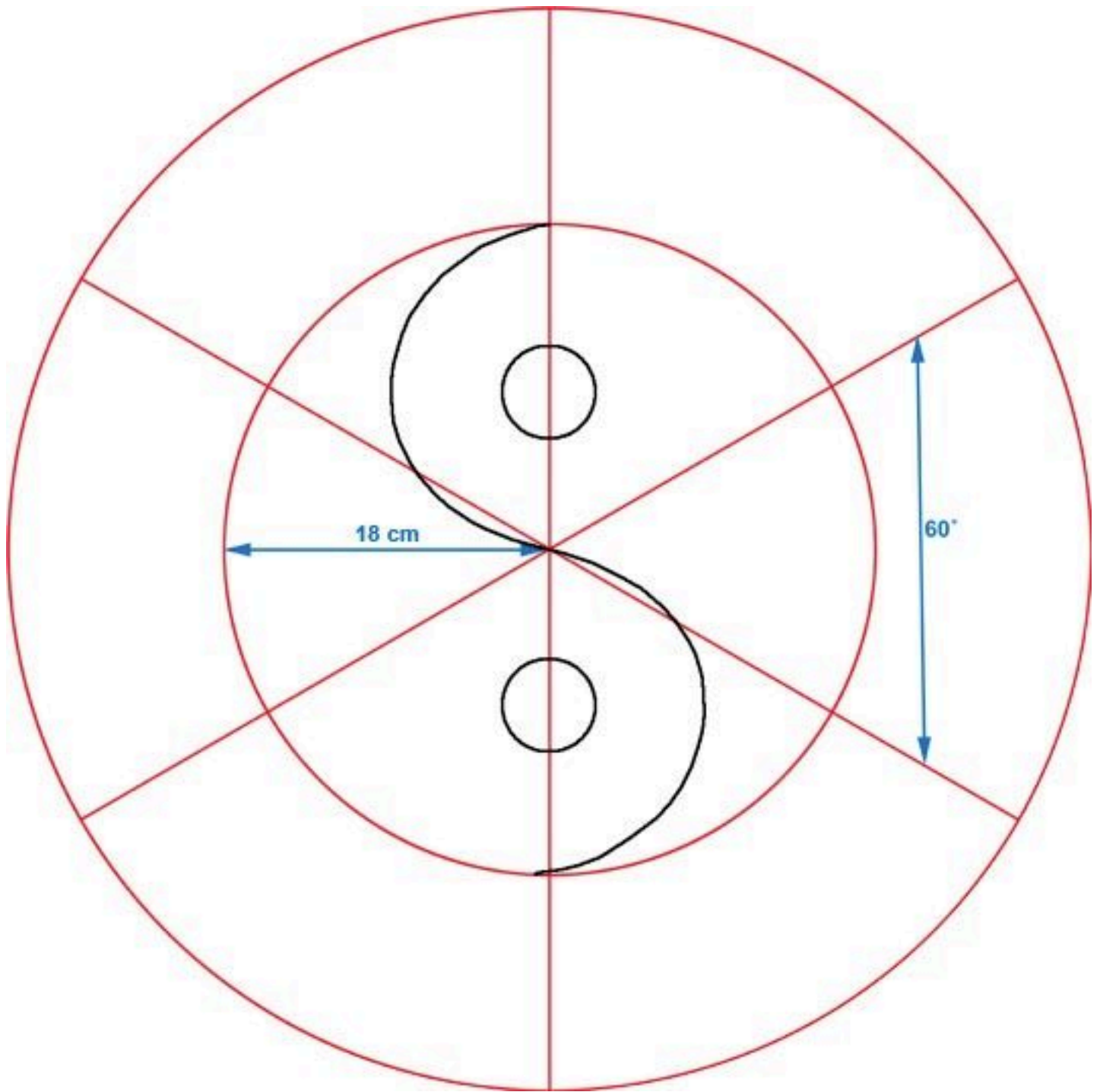
### Materials required or supplied with your kit.

Red	10 x10	5	Plywood Base 15mm min. thickness, 60cm diam.

### Tools

Required	Desirable
Curved edge tile nippers	Both curved & straight edged tile nippers
Grouting tool (or use something from around the house)	Boat Grouter & Sliding Tile cutter

## Guidelines required for "Yin & Yang" mosaic design.

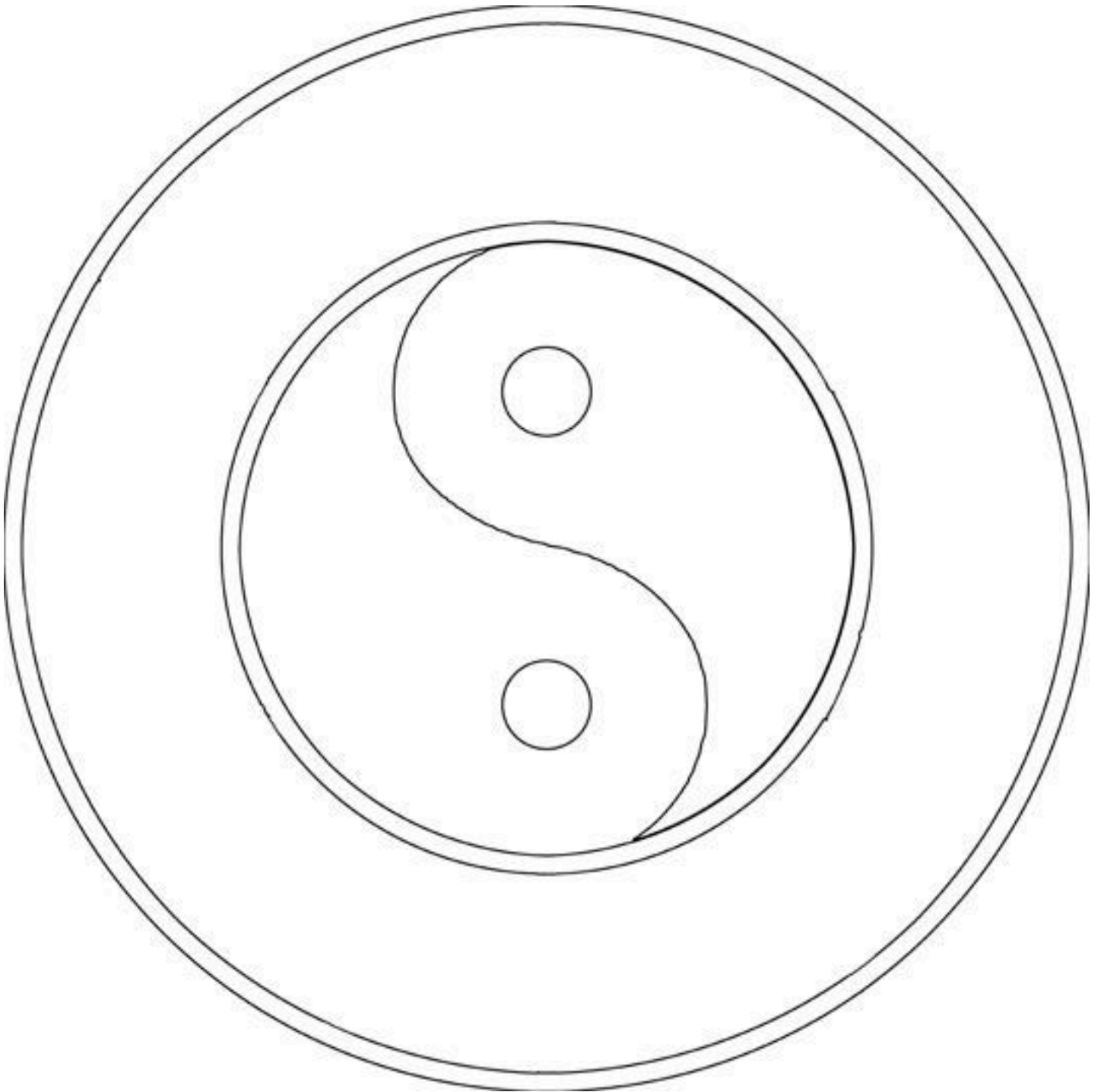


1. Draw lines as shown with a protractor & a compass
2. Manually draw in your wavy line (separating the Yin & the Yang)
3. If you plan to cut your circles whole, then no need to draw in the circles - you can place them by eye. If you are filling in the circle area, then you'll need to draw two 5 cm circles as shown.
4. You're laying your lines (borders) inside the red circles. Also, you can choose not to lay the borders - there is enough surplus tile to omit them.

## Alternative methods of transferring the design

The drawing below could be taken to a photocopy or print shop and enlarged to your desired size. You can then use carbon paper to trace the design directly onto your backing board.

You could also draw a grid on the design and a corresponding grid onto your backing board and draw the lines in yourself
